So far this year we have added two clubs. To make the District Presidents Distinguished, we need a net growth of 14. We are currently at 2,841 member payments. This number is slightly below what we anticipated, and we are proactively working with clubs that haven't yet submitted their renewals. This is not unusual and is not unique to our district. Clubs worldwide are slow to renew. Still, we do not want to be complacent about this. We have one demo meeting scheduled in Windsor next week. We currently have twenty clubs that have not yet renewed the dues for at least eight members. Two clubs have been lost, but we expect to regain the other eighteen. With the loss of two clubs, we need sixteen new clubs to achieve Presidents Distinguished.

Sue asked for suggestions of things we can do to help clubs get their dues payments submitted. The suggestions included talking to the club officers and finding out what problems they were facing, helping a new club treasured submit the dues on line and taking the time to mentor them on other aspects of the job (i.e. getting a Club Debit Card). Suggestions also included describing the benefits of renewing dues on time. Automatic dues renewals, where the member would be required to opt out of renewing, was mentioned. Open houses and Speechcraft were also mentioned. Area Directors should be focusing on the clubs in your area that haven't yet renewed at least eight members.

Club building is very important. Please bring in leads. We need leads that include the name of a Toastmasters champion in the organization.

This is a working session. Please set with your divisions. We are going to set up a watch-list for Division Directors and Area Directors to help you track your clubs and identify potential problems early. The Dashboard on the Toastmasters International website has three tabs. The first tab gives you District performance. The second has Division and Area performance, and the third is Club performance. You can export any or all of this data. I exported all three tabs into an excel spreadsheet to create a watch-list. Each division has the data for their division. This watch-list identifies four areas where a club may be having problems:

- October renewals: Any club that failed to renew at least eight members on time is exhibiting one red flag.
- Membership drop: A club with a membership drop of five or more members between July 1 and the present exhibits a red flag. If that club was not distinguished last year, they get a second flag. (Ed. Note: One club in the division I reviewed went from 32 members to 2 – that might merit three red flags.)
- Club goals met: Any club that has completed no DCP goals by mid-October gets a red flag.
- Officers list submitted on time. A club that did not submit their officer list on time gets a red flag. If it still isn't submitted, they get two.
- Officers trained. Any club with no officers trained gets a red flag.

Any club with no or one red flag is doing well and should be congratulated.

A club with two red flags is potentially in trouble and needs monitoring.

A club with three red flags is in danger and may require intervention.

A club with four or more red flags needs CPR support STAT!

This information is not static. The sheets I handed out are already out of date in some areas. Joe Fernandez has agreed to automate this data and put it on the D57 website, so you can access an up to date watch-list for your area or division at any time during the year.

This list will allow you to be proactive and have conversations with the club presidents to help them keep their clubs from imploding.

Each group was given five minutes to brainstorm about ways to assist the struggling clubs in their divisions.

Area Director of the Month: All club visit reports turned in. All dues paid on time for all the clubs. All clubs completed DCP Goal #10 (officer list and dues submitted on time).
