We were looking for closer to 200 and we are looking for a location for the Spring Conference that will hold at least 300 people. The Spring Conference will tentatively be held in either Berkeley or Emeryville. We are looking for a location other than a conference center or a hotel. In order to get booked at either of those, you need to pay for food for everyone who attends, whether they eat or not. We are looking for a venue where food can be optional for the attendees and will not be included in the price of attending the conference. We are looking at a couple of community colleges that may give the registrants an option of purchasing meals at an additional cost. This will keep the cost down for those who do not want to purchase food. We are looking for more corporate sponsorship. We are looking for a chair who will contact corporations, starting with those that are currently sponsoring clubs, to ask them to sponsor the conference

Building a Championship Club, Part 1, an interactive workshop using a Lance Miller CD. Each question was asked after hearing Lance Miller discuss the subject.

Q. - What is a Championship Club? A – They meet their goals. They decide that they will be a championship club, and they plan how to accomplish it. Their meetings run on time and are structured. They have committed leadership. They have fun. Championship clubs just do the ordinary, but they do it extraordinarily well.

A championship cub does not start a meeting scrambling to fill positions. In a championship club, all roles are filled a week in advance, cancellations are covered before the meeting starts, and the club looks like they are organized.

Q. – Why do people join a club and why do they stay?

A. – Friendly yet professional environment. Opportunity to grow. Structured meetings. Camaraderie. To enhance their career. They are building confidence. To overcome fears.

Q. – How can you inspire your clubs to think of each meeting not as just a meeting, but as an event?

A. – Don't rely on emails for all of your communication with the clubs. Phone calls are more personal and can be much more efficient. Area Directors have to reach out the Club Officers, as does the Club President. Club officers need to reach out the club members. All club members need to be encouraged to make the club successful and make the meetings into events. Every year each club should schedule one Executive Committee Meeting (preferably in July or August) for all of the club officers to review the Club Leadership Handbook so that everyone knows the specifics of their duties.

Q. – What do the Executive Committee Meetings of a Championship Club look like?

A. – There is a written agenda and it is sent out beforehand. Mentors are assigned for new members who do not already have one. Progress toward distinguished goals is reviewed. Planning for events.

Building a Championship Club, Part 2. A Championship Club starts on time and starts with a bang.

Q. – What are some ways to start a club meeting with a bang?

A. – Start with awards. Alameda Tongue Twisters starts with all members reciting a tongue twister. Introduce visitors.

Q. – What are some things that keep the enthusiasm going throughout the meeting?

A. – Positive evaluations – Use the sandwich method. Use "I" language rather than "you" language. Lots of applause. New and inexperienced members have a mentor to guide them. More experienced members are energized by encouraging them to mentor new members.

Q. – Any creative ways to get clubs to participate in the contests?

A. — At the club members, tell people that the speech they just delivered is of contest quality and they will be competing with it in the upcoming contest. Make you club speech contest a special event. Put together a committee to make the contest a special event. Put the contest on like it is an event equal to the academy awards.
